WHEREAS, the Village Board determined that the Action will have no significant adverse environmental impacts and will issue a negative declaration in accordance with \$617.7 of Title 6 of the NYCRR.

AMEND RESOLUTION #5 FROM APRIL 28 MEETING – PROJECT DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

BE IT RESOLVED, resolution #5 from the April 28 Board Meeting be amended to the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Village facilities are in need of upgrades to improve energy efficiency and occupant comfort, and reduce operational and maintenance costs, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article 9 of the New York State Energy Law, the Village has the opportunity to implement improvement needs and energy conservation measures by means of an Energy Performance Contract, and

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2007, the Village Mayor and Administrator, discussed the opportunity of receiving Energy Performance Contract proposals that will propose potential opportunities and methods to improve Village owned facilities and reduce energy related operating costs, and

WHEREAS, on August 13, 2007, the Village Board authorized the Village Administrator to issue a Request For Proposals for an Energy Performance Contract on August 16, 2007, and

WHEREAS, the Village Administrator received Energy Performance Contract proposal(s) on August 31, 2007, reviewed the proposal(s), and is recommending the selection of Wendel Energy Services, LLC, and

WHEREAS, the Village requires a detailed Energy Efficiency Study to identify and evaluate potential facility improvements, and the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) provides 50% cost-shared grant funding for an energy efficiency study amount not to exceed \$50,000, and

WHEREAS, NYSERDA grant funds may be applied toward the Energy Efficiency Study to be conducted in conjunction with an Energy Performance Contract, and

WHEREAS, the Village executed an Energy Efficiency Study agreement with NYSERDA and Wendel Duchscherer Architects and Engineers, PC, and

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WHEREAS, the results of the NYSERDA Energy Study indicate that the Village will benefit from the implementation of an energy performance contract through the installation of energy efficient facility improvement measures, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Mayor Barbara A. Alberti, or her designee, is authorized to enter into a project development agreement and subsequent agreements as required to implement an energy performance contract with Wendel Energy Services, LLC, 140 John James Audubon Parkway, Amherst, New York, for the provision of facility improvements, that would result in annual guaranteed energy savings and operational savings, that will offset the annual project payments *over the expected life of the equipment*, contingent upon the form and terms of agreement having been approved by the Village Attorney.

Also be it RESOLVED that Mayor Barbara A. Alberti, or her designee, is hereby authorized to enter into a Municipal Lease agreement with the financial institution offering the most beneficial terms in compliance with the New York State Energy Law Article 9 – Energy Performance Contracts in Connection with Public Buildings and Facilities. The form and terms of agreement must be reviewed and approved by the Village Attorney.
