Joan Priebe - 15 Howard Lane - who is the crew chief. She was told Ken Pyc.

PUBLIC HEARING LOCAL LAW #10 OF 2011 - CORRECTION OF STREET NAME - OLMSTEAD TO

Village Administrator read the legal notice regarding the public hearing for Local Law #10 of 2011— Correction of Street Name - Olmstead to Olmsted and Mayor Hoffman opened the hearing.

Copies of the local law were with each agenda.

Gabrielle Miller - 61 Olmstead Ave - that is where Sal's is located and her tax lady. Residents don't want the name changed. The additional costs to the residents is not warranted. There will be additional costs to the Village for signs, changing maps, Trustee's salary. Wanted to know if the name change would be done in exchange for grant money. Ms. Miller submitted a petition from the residents on Olmstead stating they did not want the signs changed.

Trustee Nikonowicz - the inconvenience to residents might be huge but the signs should be changed. This is the honorable thing to do for the person that designed the Village. There is no deal on the table and no funding is tied to the name change. Street signs are already being changed in the Village. This name change came about while Trustee Nikonowicz was looking for funding for the Tree Lighting.

David Charvat- 76 Olmstead Ave – what was the Tree Lighting.

Trustee Nikonowicz - There wasn't going to be a Tree Lighting and Trustee Nikonowicz stepped up and volunteered to run it. He was looking for donations and was told to contact the Olmsted Conservatory. When the Conservatory members came out to look at Depew they informed us that Olmstead was spelled incorrectly it should be Olmsted. Upon further research the name was misspelled in 1925 by a map company. We are not changing the name just correcting a mistake.

Village Attorney Aquino - no legal description change so the deeds are not redone.

Gabrielle Miller - 61 Olmstead Ave - Unemployed people and people who don't have the time. This is not critical for someone that passed away.

Donna Dotzler - 30 Warner - can't believe this is a matter of importance. All the costs of maps to the Village. Would like her tax dollars used better purposes. This will not improve the quality of life. Spoke about issues with the sewer pumps.

Mayor instructed Ms. Priebe to address the Board when speaking.

Chris Kelchlin - 76 Olmstead - never has been asked about misspelled name. This is best to be left alone. Spoke about parked cars on sidewalks, car dealers, and music being played loudly while driving down the street. Suggested placing a sign under the sign with the name.

Joan Priebe - 15 Howard - Reiniterated it does not matter because he is dead. We should give the rightful legacy. There were 5 designs in Depew and with DOT redoing Broadway that eliminated one. Veteran's Park has restrictons and can only be used as a park. It was only spelled right for 30 years.

Trustee Nolder - The name is misspelled. We are having a public hearing to see what the public says. It is good to have the public here. We want to hear from our constituents. He liked the idea of the sign on the sign. We are out to do the right thing.

Irv Reinig - 380 Columbia Ave - have lived in the Village for over 30 years. Dumb idea. It will be years before the records are cleaned up for the people living on the street. So many things the Village should be doing. Work on taxes, spending and debt issues.

Mayor Hoffman - purpose of the public hearing is for positive information.

Trustee Pecora - we have the public hearing to bring the info to the public not be accused.

David Charvat - 76 Olmstead - opposed to name change. Has a good friend that works for the Conservatory and he has never brought up the spelling of the name.

Gabrielle Miller - 61 Olmstead - if anything like this happens again the Board needs to send out letters instead of us reading about it in the Depew Bee. Table this tonight to give people another opportunity to speak. Happy New Үеаг.
